Backgrounder

- Ronda is a long-time member who last year as Treasurer revamped the financial accounting procedures of Gender Mosaic.
- Diana Coltridge, who has been associated with the club for a number of years, is actively involved in the gay community and club outreach. She recently served partial terms as Vice President and Treasurer.
- Carol joined the club almost three years ago and joins the Executive Committee for the first time.
- Gail, the only female significant other who maintains an active membership, also joins the Executive for the first time. She is one of five members with the GM Bylaws Committee.

Ottawa (NFTU) -- She proposes a leadership which does not direct people - but involves them. "We are looking for people...we can make Gender Mosaic help you grow as a person and help you be a better person," says Ronda, the 4th Gender Mosaic President, who was elected early this month.

At the February 15th GM workshop at the ALGBO center, outgoing President Joanne Law handed over club business to Ronda who presented an agenda of inclusion and financial responsibility. "It's important to have fun and grow from it. We can grow as a group and as a fact in society," she stated.

Decisions stemming from a flurry of private post election Executive Committee meetings were handed over to members along with a hefty business agenda.

An anonymous suggestion box was introduced which will be present at meetings and socials. Ideas, comments and criticisms placed in it will be reviewed by the Executive Committee. Ronda called for volunteers to join and help form club committees - pointing to a serious need for event locations and new member greeters.

Election Night

Ottawa (NFTU) -- Joanne Law officially announced her resignation as President of Gender Mosaic on the night of elections February 4, 1995 at a social at Hanné's. More than a third of the sixteen persons present, who were eligible to vote, were recent additions to the Gender Mosaic membership list.

Only one of the four Executive positions required a ballot. Former Vice President Linda lost by two votes (9-7) to Diana Coltridge. The other three elected officers were acclaimed. A snowstorm is blamed for the failure of a number of other members to show that night. Carol was the only Executive Committee member acclaimed who was not present.

Transgendered Rights Recognized

San Francisco (Workers World Service) -- On December 12 the San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed legislation outlawing discrimination against transgendered people.

The law amends Article 33 of the Police Code by adding transgendered people to the list of groups protected. This allows the city's Human Rights Commission to, "investigate, mediate, and issue findings," about discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations and educational institutions, as well as in city government.

While this law has the same limitations as other civil-rights measures under capitalism, it

does provide relief from flagrant and open harassment by police, or denial of access to health-care clinics and homeless shelters. Public accommodations include public bathrooms, so the law gives transgendered people the legal right to use these facilities.

This victory came as a result of an increasingly organized and politicized transgendered community, as well as alliances formed with the lesbian, gay and bisexual movement. Transgendered activists and supporters have been pressuring the city extensively since May. Groups such as Transgendered Action and Queer Nation have been organizing against transgendered oppression for several years.

What About CD/TS Youth?

They are a forgotten lot - underage transpersons. But they do exist and some want to come out...if there was a place to go. But mixing youth into an adult environment, as is the case with most trans support groups, can be a tricky affair without some legal advice and available counselling. The last thing a group needs are lawsuits laid against it's members by angry religious parents, or to disenfranchise a youth trying to come out because no one knows what to say.

The current practice of suggesting to minors they go to the Royal Ottawa Hospital's psychiatrists is in many cases inappropriate and results in the opening of a medical file. Other alternatives need to be available to help a youth explore his/her sexuality and gender identity in a caring environment.

The Youth Services Bureau on Besserer street reports they have had some experience with CD's and TS's. Their Drop-In center offers a professional staff with confidential private counselling for youths aged 12 to 24. The Ottawa Unit on MacLaren offers confidential counselling too. Pink Triangle Services on Bank street also offers a youth group on Wednesday nights.

Trans groups FACTT and Gender Mosaic provide experienced support for adults but to date have limited abilities with youth. These groups are ideal launch points for a transcommunity youth service. But some legal issues should first be looked at.

The University of Ottawa Community Legal Clinic, HIV division, says that in legal terms a non-alcoholic social or workshop can be compared to a church group meeting. In other words, it should be legally safe to allow a teenager to drop into a meeting for information.

However this comment comes with the warning that in being a transcommunity support group, you are dealing with greater social scrutiny. If a legal case were pressed, one should expect the courts to side with the classic "White Anglo-Saxon" viewpoint.

First Constitution In Works

Committee to Release Draft Soon

Ottawa (NFTU) -- Checks and balances to protect the confidentiality of members, an Ombudswoman office, and a Code of Ethics are promised in a set of Bylaws being drafted by a Gender Mosaic committee. Chaired by Sophy, the Bylaws Committee of five current and past members was created by a membership vote in late autumn to author a first ever constitution for GM. In a verbal report on February 15th at the ALGBO center, Sophy reported a draft will likely be released at the March workshop with a discussion and vote expected in April.

"The committee voted to keep the draft confidential to prevent misinterpretation of unfinished pages," said Sophy adding it is about six pages long. Four committee meetings have been held so far with a few more anticipated before the draft is completed. Other members on the committee are: Linda, Karen Patrick, Gail and former GM President Alison.

A first ever announced annual budget was unanimously approved at the meeting. The \$1,518 budget anticipates a \$77 surplus by fiscal year end. "We have money in the bank and it's enough to get us through the year," said Ronda. As of February 15th the club had \$742.12 in cash assets. Last year at this time GM was in financial crisis.

A proposal to hold elections in the autumn to coincide with the club fiscal year end was deferred to the April meeting. At the meeting, a 1994 membership decision to allow alcohol at social events for a six month trial period was extended permanently with only one of the 12 members present dissenting. A promise was also made by the new Executive to review the fall membership questionnaire and report back in March. Ronda expressed Executive Committee support to continue GM involvement with Pride Week events and the Ottawa Police Bias Crime Unit.

Under the new Presidency, day to day business and appointments will be handled by the Executive committee with a report issued at the next membership meeting. Members may challenge any decision and call for a vote or discussion. Ronda is promising to limit her own personal opinions at club meetings to offer a better platform to the membership.

An Executive proposal to discuss workshop formats was deferred until March because the hurried meeting was cutoff by the arrival of another group at the ALGBO center.

Group for Women Significant Others

Ottawa (NFTU) -- Local counsellor Mary Hogan-Finley is offering to conduct a two hour group session for transcommunity significant others. The session, which could accommodate up to ten people, will cost \$10 per person. At this time no date has been set. Hogan-Finley has been researching crossdressing for some time. Women interested in joining the session should contact Joanne Law through the Gender Mosaic Helpline at 770-1945.

ALGBO runs a Gay non-alcoholic Coffee Club on Friday nights which occasionally attract minors. "We've never had a problem with that," says ALGBO's Bill Hunter referring to the possibility of irate parents wanting to sue or lay charges for "perverting their child."

But for regular youth participation in a primarily adult group, the Legal Clinic suggests proof of age from potential new members. An application form which includes a place for a parental or legal guardian signature of consent would allow a youth to legally join at least most non-alcohol club events.

In the case of a minor who reports his/her parents do not know or accept, the Youth Services Bureau would be the proper place to handle this kind of potentially explosive situation without causing personal alienation.

A Youth Branch is a likely evolution in the responsibilities of the transcommunity. The direction of this kind of move should be to both protect adult membership as well as removing legal barriers to youths who need help.

Edmonton (From CP File) -- A cross Alberta MLA charged government waste over a grant from the provincial Lottery Fund. The Night Gallery, an alternative Calgary arts and theatre group, recently presented a forum titled, "Bound to be tongue-tied: Gagging on gender." An event advertisement promised demos of crossdressing, body piercing, sadomasochism and computerized gender alterations. The ad included the insignia for Alberta Lotteries.

"T've said consistently that I don't want to be a censor," said deputy premier Ken Kowalski who is also minister for Alberta Lotteries.

backbencher Lorne Taylor charged, "in these days of declining resources, what is the justification for taxpayer dollars going into a project like this?

Kowalski promised to look into the grant to determine if it was appropriate.

Dear Editor:

It seems that the business meetings at GM lack the common methods and procedures of other organizations. The mode of operation seems to be that everyone talks at once and the person with the loudest voice is the only one heard. More aggressive members seem to feel that it is their right to simply talk over other members who are attempting to express their views. There also seems to be a lack of seriousness. Often jokes and off-track comments end up derailing what could have been a beneficial discussion of the topic being raised.

In order for business meetings to be worthwhile I feel that some rules need to be written down and followed. A suggestion I have is that one person who is not a member of the executive could act as a moderator during meetings. This person could say something such as "The floor recognizes..." followed by the person's name when someone wishes to speak. The moderator would also work to ensure that when someone is speaking they are allowed to talk without interruption. The moderator could also act to bring the group back into focus when joking around or off-topic subjects cause the meeting to go off on a tangent.

In most cases a simple respect for other's right to speak could go a long way in making GM business meetings more beneficial. At present this respect is lacking.

GM Prez Joanne Moves On

Ottawa (NFTU) -- She has been criticized for holding the reigns too tight - but she is also regarded as a leader who dedicated her fulltime efforts to this club.

On February 4th, Joanne Law voluntarily stepped down as President of Gender Mosaic - ending a near four year tenure which brought this group further into the outside world.

In her own personal life, Joanne has lived in her feminine role more and more since joining GM in its early days. In the past few years as President, she has lived as her feminine self nearly fulltime. That time was used to personally advance GM in finding more transfriendly stores, organizing functions, meeting new members, and reaching out.

1994 was Joanne's banner year to step out onto a larger stage. She appeared on CHRO-TV, was interviewed on 54Rock's Sex with Sue radio show, and was part of a Stonewall Commemoration program on Carleton U's student FM station. She helped hold the GM banner in the summer Gay Pride day parade which saw the largest turnout in its local history. Joanne was also involved in the Pride Day organizing committee and increased outreach contact with the Gay community.

In September last year, GM took a large step in moving it's business meetings from Joanne's personal home to the ALGBO center downtown. It was the first time for the club to meet regularly in an open location.

But Joanne's ambitions can not be said to have come without cost. Critics expressed concern over an apparent growing forcefulness and control of too many functions. It is a seemingly common charge in many groups after a leader has remained for a lengthy period. However, on election day she silenced her critics by officially announcing her resignation from the GM executive.

Joanne remains a valued member and has agreed to serve as club Librarian. She will continue to answer the club phoneline for an undetermined time. Outside GM, she is still writing her regular crossdressing column in the Hot 'n Bothered newspaper. An ambitious personal plan may include a late year opening of a crossdresser's specialty store somewhere in the region.

Medical Notes

Estrogen, the Smart Drug?

Buffalo (From Ottawa Sun) -- A U.S. researcher reports older women can beef up their brains with estrogen. Dr. Uriel Halbreich of State University of New York at Buffalo says the estrogen doesn't create a sudden genius, but post menopausal women taking hormone replacements are able to think and remember more keenly.

Gender Risks in Health

Toronto (From CP File) -- The Heart and Stroke Foundation reports some health risks are unique to women. Smoking and taking oral contraceptives dramatically increase a woman's risk of a heart attack. More men develop heart disease and are at risk at an earlier age than women. But the gap narrows after menopause and evens at about age 65. Blood cholesterol is at higher risk for heart disease in older women because of reduced estrogen levels. The female hormone promotes the "good" cholesterol creating a natural protection. Many studies show improved cardiovascular health and protection from osteoporosis with estrogen replacement in older women.

Pollution Emasculating Life?

Science News ran a two part series in the summer on pollutants which may be emasculating human males and wildlife around the world. Many of these, such as pesticides, are present in drinking water, urban air and food. These pollutants are suspected of interfering with normal fetal development by either blocking male hormones or mimicking female hormones.

A list of 45 environmental contaminants or classes of agents in the October Environmental Health Perspectives paper include herbicides, fungicides, insecticides, and commercial chemicals. Most of the agents of greatest concern are now banned from use but remain present in the environment.

The article points to research indicating an alarming drop in sperm count in human males over two generations. Other conditions such as testicular cancer in adults and undescended testes in newborn males appears to be on the rise.

"Environmental hormones" are suspected of gender-bending effects on birds, alligators and fish which have already begun to exhibit the emasculating of these pollutants.

Medical experts say early human development depends on a series of molecular "switches" to produce males. If these biological signals don't take place a female is produced by default. Researchers are seeking to identify the precise mechanisms of this natural female-to-male transformation in birth. In humans, the male reproductive tract begins development around the seventh to 14th weeks of pregnancy. If pollutants mimicking female hormones are present in a certain quantity at a critical stage, male development can be interfered with.

The Silent Tree Fall

"Two months ago a Gender Mosaic member on a rare mall outing was spotted by a surprised fellow worker. He was fired from his \$42,000 a year job two days later, cited for poor performance despite nine years of service and two promotions. The company is prepared to offer only a small out of court money settlement. This member is asking for our support...a noisy rally in front of his old office to attract media attention to a serious social injustice against crossdressers."

Would YOU show up?

It will be a soul searching moment if (or when) this situation occurs here. For many, such a public act of unity would justifiably be too great a leap of personal risk. A tree...a life, would fall silently in the social forest.

Before our community can effectively take on the larger world, we need to consider our local environs first. We can not mold the masses until we can cope with ourselves, our peers, and our own town. This is not simply the act of repeating aloud, "I'm okay" once a month at a private club social. It is about how we grow in self realization and personal expression. It's about overcoming genuine fear from social stigma. And about how we get there.

Gain Dignity - End the Isolation

Only one who accepts the inner self may embrace another and those differences which inevitably arise. True dignity is demanding of respect for self and others. Isolation is caused by selfishness, division, constant self justification, and fear.

The transcommunity is a forum for offering help and friendly environs - not forcing it. We must recognize that none is above another...we are all simply unique. Do we dread our sexuality or that of others? Do we judge ourselves and others by superficial standards? Do we strive to promote serious arenas of discussion to attain self understanding? Do we help those we affect to better cope with our realities? Do we still fear too much?

Before we may truly take on the world to create our longed for utopia, we must deal with those things which reside within and around us. These are the major challenges which we must focus on, simply...the little things...the real things. Only then, in time, can we defiantly stop the silent tree falls.

Sun Bashes Transsexuals

The Ottawa Sun's editorial staff have carried their NDP bashing into the transcommunity. The Friday February 17th editorial chastises Ontario Health Minister Ruth Grier's defence of funding sex reassignment surgery while dropping 20 other procedures including circumcision of new-borns from OHIP coverage. The money (up to seven approvals a year at \$25,000 each) does not seem to be the issue for the Sun Rather, they make light of transsexuality.

"Granted, the moon is full this week and strange things can happen, but isn't this ruling on full-funding for sex-change operations taking the NDP's affirmative action program to a ridiculous extreme?" they say. In The Closet

Everyone has their fears. It's a natural part of life. You may have a family or wife who doesn't know, a career to protect. Maybe you just don't really want to walk down Rideau street in full drag...that shouldn't be a source of guilt!

Protecting your privacy is an important part of crossdressing for most. You step out at your own speed and should make no apologizes for it. So let's deal with some practical matters.

Open your own postal box for starters. It allows you to receive all kinds of mail (like NFTU) under any name you want. Boxes range in price, but at last check it was about \$60 a year. The box is registered under your legal name, but mail is sorted according to box number and names don't matter. You can have mail forwarded to your initials. The postal service will only take exception if they think you are operating a business in a private box as business rates are almost double.

Getting dressed for a transcommunity social is fairly easy as long as you bring your clothes with you. Arrange to arrive a bit early and change in the bathroom. Bring some baby oil or makeup remover so you will leave with no traces afterward. If you're a new member, just show up in your regular male clothes, relax and get to know a few people until you feel comfortable enough to change. Most of all, try not worry about how you look the first time. Yes, it's important to look great, but don't stop yourself because you're not Christy Brinkley. No one is anyway!

If you have to store your clothes in the garage, try to wash-them once in a while. Do this at a laundromat. If you're worried about people seeing things, just mix in a few male items and they'll figure you're married. If you look nervous they will stare, but not because of what you're washing. It'll be because they'll be wondering why you're such a nervous guy!

Do the Right Thing...But Why?

As a TS, you are expected to jump through all kinds of hoops for doctors and psychiatrists. The idea is that you are supposed to prove that you can successfully live and be accepted as a woman. It is presumed that if you can heel, rollover and learn various other tricks, you will be rewarded eventually with the carrot of approval for surgery. (Notice I said "the carrot of approval" rather than the approval itself. But that's another story) Believe it or not you can end up facing discrimination for becoming too good at "passing".

I spent about six years spending all of my spare time preparing for living full-time. Thousands of hours were spent on electrolysis, practicing my voice, mannerisms, movements, and developing my appearance. Becoming a woman was too important for me to risk ruining my chances for success by not being properly prepared in

time until after I was ready and mostly passable. After I had been living full time for a few months I came into contact with some "big league" doctors and psychiatrists and I became quite adept at doing things to prove to them that I could make it.

The worst problem that I have now is that after two years, I am still unemployed. I live on welfare and can never afford to go out, eat properly, or buy myself the things that most people take for granted. I spent last winter living in a motel room where white fiving in a moter from where the average temperature rarely went above 60, and on more than one occasion was as low as 46 degrees. During that time I'd usually have a can of beans one day and pea soup the next, and nothing more. Great for the waist line. I lost 14 pounds. But not good for the soul.

During this time I was seeing an occupational therapist who no matter

advance. I never began living full-how upset I was, would only tell me time until after I was ready and how great I was doing. Why? Because mostly passable. After I had been I passed. She told me that I was doing better than most TS's she knew at being accepted as a woman. She later decided that she couldn't do anything to help since I was doing so well.

> I have encountered this attitude with everyone that I have met who an employment counsellor, psychiatrist or therapist who claimed to be able to help me get a job. One place, a service that helps people who have barriers to getting employment has pretty much put me on the back burner. After making all kinds of promises, nothing has come through. It seems as if they are assuming that since I "pass" I can therefore get a job on my own without any special help. I am also now getting increasing threats from Welfare that I will get cut off if I don't keep looking for a job. This combined with living in total poverty is adding unbearable stress to my life.

Many TS's are getting Family Benefits Allowance so that they can adjust to their new gender role without the pressures of daily financial survival. This also spares them pressure from their Welfare worker. Guess what? I can't get FBA. Why? Because I am doing too well. After all, I pass! I have approached After all, I pass! I have approached two psychiatrists about getting FBA and was refused by both. One says that going on FBA will hurt my chances of getting approval for surgery with the Clarke Institute. They both say that because I have had job interviews as a woman that I have therefore accomplished too much. My occupational therapist used the fact that I had gone out dancing a few times as a woman in a singles bar as her reason for deciding that I was doing too well to be considered for

I am a young male to female transsexual who is just coming out of her closet. On the whole I would consider myself passable, except for being tall. Nothing that I read or any advice I received could have truly prepared me for the first time I was

The incident occurred on a May afternoon and will remain etched in stone forever in my mind. I left my apartment, that is in a neighborhood that is not exactly friendly to anybody who is not a white Anglo-Saxon male. I was in the elevator with a couple of other people, who accepted me as I appeared. Feeling confident I left my apartment building.

I was walking from the building to I was walking from the building to catch a bus to go downtown before my 5 o'clock doctor's appointment. On my way, I passed by three teenage boys. I must admit that they made me entirely too nervous. Two of the boys just kept walking past, but one of them read me. This individual stopped in front of me and made the comment, "nice clothes buddy!" buddy!

I was initially floored by the event. I ducked back into the building and quickly recovered. I retrieved my sunglasses from my purse and put them on, in case tears started to flow. Once again I tried to make my way to the bus stop. With my confidence and composure regained, I was sure that the boys were long gone. Big mistakeĺ

The same boys drove by me as I walked and started yelling things at me. The only thing that I could pick out was the first thing that they yelled at me. "Look at the guy in the black coat dressed as a woman," they screamed! There were many other barbs being thrown at me but the first one was stuck in my mind and blocked the others out.

I have always been a rather shy person who would tend to blend into the background whenever possible. I could not seem to shake the feeling that every set of eyes on the world were upon me. I was wishing the earth would swallow me up whole. Still, being close to home I just retreated and cried for what seemed to be an hour

The incident did not best me though. After recovering fully and fixing myself up again, I went to my doctor's office fully dressed.



Acknowledging one's fear is a step. It is not growth. Talk is cheap.

The context of the column will be our relationship with society. More and more people are talking of improving that relationship. There is a linkage here. Strengthening our relationship with society is very dependant on our success in strengthening relationships with ourselves and with others in our "community". It means heightening the baseline level of reality with which we accept each other. It means...well, the title says it all.

Many speak of working towards a TV friendly society, a society that accepts the reality of our existence and accepts our relevance; a world where we don't have to hide what we are and what we do. To some it is said in the tone of wishful thinking, a fantasy one has with one's eyes closed. To others it is a real goal to be achieved, even if TV's have to give up everything that makes their crossdressing an enjoyable, if not magical experience. Too many of these people are incomplete humans whose people are incomplete humans whose people are incomplete humans whose people siften is compensated for by an inconsistent sense of moral superiority. They scream for acceptance like pitful sheep, and then turn around and discriminate against people over trivial things as skirt lengths and facial hair. To say that they have missed the boat is an understatement. It seems the more "organized" TV's get the more they generate institutionalized hypocrisy, and the more irrelevant they become to society at large.

I put forth to you that the goal of a TV friendly world is impossible in society as it is currently organized. That trying to work towards this goal entirely within the current "system" and its methods and ethos, will reward us with mere tokenism at best.

What is required is a revolution in the way society looks at itself. Now the word "revolution" evokes pleasant images of thousands of deserving people hanging by their necks down long rows of telephone poles. This type of revolution, as exciting as they are, is bad for TV's as, their aftermaths leave people too busy dealing with real events to spare any time for dressing up. The revolution we would require, would in hindsight, amount to nothing more significant than an attitude adjustment - a subtle focusing of the lens through which people look at the world, a deeper understanding of how the golden rule

can be applied to every aspect of life and every institution in our society. It means building an ethical society. Now this is something bigger than crossdressing itself.

TV's do not come out of closets to participate in social revolutions. I didn't. I came out because I had some serious itches that desperately needed some scratching. One cannot demand that TV's risk jobs, career status over something no more significant than male fantasy fulfillment.

One can however remind ourselves that TV's, despite themselves, are very uniquely positioned to comment on and induce change in our society. Consider the demographics of your typical TV club. Most of these TV's are white, conservative hetero males. Income wise we are middle to upper middle class. We are the people that every other group loves to hate. We are the establishment. We participate in this society's institutions, we are plugged into its structures, understand its processes, its ethos, its criteria for success. We represent objective reason, order, logic and scientific management in an increasingly bureaucratic society that rewards efficient work-aholic conformists.

At the same time we're TV's who inhabit the other extreme of the social scale and prance about the other extreme of the human psyche. We are both in society and out of society. We are the intersection of Order and Chaos and we can navigate in either sea. We are well situated to understand how Order can both liberate and imprison. We are well situated to understand how chaos is required for creativity and how it can also destroy. We are well placed to optimize the two to further our world and society in general. We do that by applying ethical principles to see if they are being used to help people do the things they need to, or are getting in their way.

Something that a lot of TV's haven't yet realized is that we don't have to be fodder for Hollywood comedies, or filler for the continuous demands of television. We are dangerous people, and our knowledge once verbalized and acted upon, can be very detrimental to the established order of doing things.

Of course there are no guarantees. Everything boils down to personality and circumstance, and we need our share of bald-assed luck to make a TV-friendly world. There is however one more

It also marked the first time that Gender Mosaic formally recognized support of the gay rights movement. However, a flurry of post parade fundraisers was required to successfully pay off creditors.

Mississauga (Monarch) -- Toronto area transgroup, Monarch, has lowered its annual dues by nearly half to \$40. The new rate took effect January 1st.
